SEBASTOPOL — The Laguna de Santa Rosa Foundation has pulled together money from several sources to fund a new pilot restoration project for the beleaguered waterway.

"We want to create more ponding of the water, to slow down the flow and create habitat," said Kim Cordell, president of the foundation board and manager of the \$130,000 project.

She said the Laguna has suffered from human activity in its uplands, including Santa Rosa and Cotati, as well as along its banks.
