Water fills shallow vernal pools, invigorating millions of seeds lying dormant for months.

This is the magic of the Laguna de Santa Rosa watershed: a rhythm of rain and renewal that has powered our landscapes for millennia. And now, in a time of droughts, biodiversity loss, and deep uncertainty, it's more powerful than ever.

Because with every storm, we don't just witness recovery. We are part of that renewal.

Your gift today helps build upon over 35 years of watershed stewardship, collaboration, and community engagement by planting seeds of hope that our work today will help sustain the Laguna de Santa Rosa for generations to come.

From millions of seeds grown in our nursery, Sonoma County's endangered wildflowers will rise again in the vernal pools they once called home. Sebastopol meadowfoam. Burke's goldfields. Sonoma sunshine. Each one a living thread in the rich fabric of our watershed.

These wildflowers grow nowhere else on Earth.

Only 10% of Sonoma County's vernal pool habitat is estimated to remain. Once widespread across the Santa Rosa Plain, these seasonal wetlands are now among the rarest ecosystems in California. They are fragile. Ephemeral. Contributing to Earth's biodiversity, they are indicators of environmental health.

The future feels unpredictable and the climate reminds us, year after year, how quickly things can change. On top of rising waters, burning forests, and national fractures, even landmark protections like the Endangered Species Act and Clean Water Act face renewed threats.
